

OFFICE MEMORANDUM

The undersigned is directed to convey the approval of the President to the admission of the employees of the Tata Institute of Fundamental Research to the CHSS of the Department subject to the terms and conditions laid down below. Pending a decision on the deviations proposed by the Institute with regard to certain benefits/limitations laid down in the Scheme, the employees of the Institute are allowed to avail of the facilities available under the Scheme with effect from the date of their registration under the Scheme, subject to the following conditions.


- 1) An option will be given to all employees of the Institute for admission to the Scheme. Once an employee opts for admission it will not be open for him to opt out of the Scheme/excepting once during his service with the Institute subject to the conditions that such revised option shall be effective from the beginning of the financial year. Option to opt out of the Scheme once exercised shall be final.
- 2) Existing employees who do not opt initially for the CHSS will not be admitted at any future date.
- 3) New entrants to the service of the Institute will be allowed to exercise an option within a period of one month of their joining. The condition as to the second option as enumerated in (1) above shall also apply to new entrants.
- 4) TIFR will be charged per beneficiary on the basis of per capita expenditure incurred by the CHS Scheme in the concerned financial year. The payments would be made quarterly, provisionally on the basis of the available expenditure figures and adjusted later on the basis of actuals.
- 5) It shall be the responsibility of the Institute to recover from the employees the amount of the subscription which will be retained by TIFR. TML
